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News from our Classrooms



Year R/1 - Phoenix

Wow! What a fantastic term the R/1 children have had. A big highlight has been their weekly forest school sessions. They have enjoyed cooking over open fires, making their own bows and arrows, and exploring the forest to find bugs amongst lots of other things! For their last session on Tuesday, the children were lucky enough to make their own pizzas which were delicious!

In the classroom, the children have loved learning all about different occupations and people that help us within our community. The Reception children have become superstar writers, writing all of the facts they know about different occupations and the Year ones have adapted the story 'The Last stop on Market Street'. In Maths, the reception children have impressed me with their 3D shape knowledge and the Year ones have been showing great confidence in their measuring! Well done on another amazing term Phoenix class!

Year 2 - Dragon

What a busy half term Dragon class have had! In Maths, we have finished our unit about Properties of Shape - looking at sides, vertices, edges and faces of 2D and 3D shapes! We have now just begun our Fractions unit that we will continue after the holidays. In English, we have finished our narrative from 'The Marvellous Fluffy Squishy Itty Bitty' by Beatrice Alemagna. They also wrote a recount this week, about our visit to West Lodge Farm Park, that happened earlier in the term. In Science, we have explored the basic needs of wild animals to finish our unit of Animals, this also linked to our Geography topic of Kenya. We finished this unit too this week, we compared the towns of Northampton and Kisii identifying similarities and differences. In RE, we have been exploring the Easter story and working on our section of the Big Frieze - the Fall - the children have been reflective and imaginative with ways to represent this part of the big story. In DT this half term, we have made free standing sculptures for Safari animals linking to our Science and Geography units! Year 2 also performed their Poetry this week to the rest of the school, they recited 'Edible Bedroom' by Joshua Seigal. They thoroughly enjoyed learning and performing this and were creative with their actions! Happy Easter Dragon class. 😊

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Year 3/4 - Centaur

Centaur class have been having a mighty busy end to the term! This week we have been planning and writing our persuasive holiday brochures for a range of exotic destinations. The children have all worked really hard on these, using persuasive language and writing techniques we have been working on in class over the last few weeks. In Science, we have also completed our unit of work on States of Matter. This week, we have been exploring how temperature affects the rate of evaporation, and completing written reports about how the Water Cycle works. We have also conducted a very exciting experiment to discover which type of chocolate melts at the quickest rate - white, milk or dark. In Geography, we have continued our work on London, producing sketch maps to show how London has changed over time, from the first Roman settlement, to the London of 2022. We have also been exploring land use in the City of London, and comparing the different types of buildings. Finally, we have been busy working on our Design and Technology project for this half term - designing, making and evaluating books with mechanisms for younger children. This has been so much fun! Well done Centaur class - a productive half term filled with lots of hard work, learning and laughter. Happy Easter 😊



Year 5/6 - Griffin

It has been extremely busy in Griffin class over the last few weeks! The children have been working extremely hard this term and have made good progress, this has been reflected in their end of term assessments. Last week, most of our class attended the week long residential in Govilon. I think it is fair to say all the children had the BEST time and the Year 5's already can't wait to go again next year! The children were an absolute credit to our school, showing our school values and being determined to try all the activities. I was very proud of them all. In our final week of term, the children have completed their independent writes on deforestation. The focus for this unit has been on persuasive speeches and the children have looked at Greta Thunberg's speeches on Climate Change for inspiration. The children have written some very powerful speeches - well done! In Science, the children were investigating thermal insulators. They had three different materials for cups (ceramic, paper and plastic) and needed to record the temperature each minute to see which material was the best insulator. Great teamwork was shown during their experiments! Have a lovely break over the Easter holidays Griffin Class and I will see you in the Summer Term. 😊
