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#### News and Views from the classrooms this week



#### Year R/1 - Phoenix

Wow! What an amazing start to school Phoenix class have had. I couldn't be prouder of how the reception children have settled into their new school routines and the Year 1 children have been fantastic role models for them. We have enjoyed getting to know each other the last few weeks with lots of circle time games and exploring the indoor and outdoor areas. We have enjoyed reading the colour monster and the rainbow fish. We have some super writers in year 1 who have written lovely descriptions on the rainbow fish and the reception children have drawn some lovely family portraits. In maths, the year 1 children have been learning how to sort items into groups and how to represent numbers in a variety of ways. In Science this term, the children are learning about the human body. The children enjoyed drawing around each other and labelled their key body parts. In History, the children are learning about themselves and their families. They loved sharing their all about me bags with the class and it was lovely to see how confident each child was sharing their special items. Well done on a brilliant start to school Phoenix class. keep it up! 😂



#### Year 2 - Dragon

Wow Dragon Class! What a great start it has been to Year 2. I am so proud of how hard you are working and how nicely you are all settling in to the new academic year. In Math's, we have been working hard on our understanding of place value. We have been using lots of practical equipment to help us identify tens and ones. In English, we having been focusing on Grammar. We have been focusing on the importance of punctuation, as well as developing our understanding of nouns, adjectives and verbs. We are also very excited to start our writing unit based on a class book favourite 'The Day the Crayons Quit'. In reading, we are extending our abilities to infer and have been making assumptions based on what we have read. In our science topic, we are looking at everyday materials. We have been working scientifically and have identified and classified a range of materials. In history, we are looking at The Great Fire of London. We have been looking at a range of sources and discussing what information they give us about the fire in 1666. In RE, we are looking at who is Muslim and their key beliefs. In DT, we have been focusing on fire engines and are currently in the process of designing our own fire engine made from a variety of materials. 🕄



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Year 3/4 - Centaur

It has been a busy start to the term for Centaur class. In English, we have spent the first few weeks focusing on grammar and punctuation, in readiness for beginning our first writing unit on "Stone Age Boy" next week. We have looked at different types of sentences, and reminded ourselves on how to punctuate these correctly. In Math's, we have been working on finding 1/10/100 and 1000 more or less than a number. and have learned how to represent and partition numbers in different ways using lots of practical equipment. Our Science has got off to a super start, and we have had fun experimenting with different equipment to make simple electrical circuits. We found out that we can have more than one appliance in a circuit, and that a circuit has to be complete with no breaks in order to work. In History, we have begun our work on the Stone Age, and developed our chronology skills to learn when the Stone Age period was, and how it was split into three main parts. We have used different sources to compare the differences in the Old, Middle and New Stone Age and found out lots of interesting facts about the changes during these periods. Year 5/6 - Griffin

Griffin class have made an excellent start to the new year! Over the last three weeks in English, we have been revising different grammar objectives to make sure we feel confident ready for our writing lessons. Next week, the children will be starting to write a Greek Myth.

In Science, the children have been learning all about electricity. They have looked at drawing circuits using the correct scientific symbols and made observations about the brightness of bulbs in circuits.

In Math's, Year 6 have just finished their place value unit, which they all worked incredibly hard on and they are ready to start their next unit about the four operations.

In Art with Mr Adams, the children have been exploring different ways of creating portraits, using a collage technique and writing words which describe them, they look brilliant! Have a lovely weekend Griffin Class. ©
