<u>Term Dates</u>

An additional bank holiday in honour of the Coronation of His Majesty King Charles III will take place on <u>Monday 8th May 2023</u>. As this date had previously been announced as the first day of the 2023 key stage 2 (KS2) test week in England, a change to the KS2 test schedule will be necessary.

Ministers have considered the situation carefully and have decided that KS2 tests will take place in the same week with tests following the usual order but each taking place one day later than originally planned. As such, the new schedule will be:

- Tuesday 9th May: English grammar, punctuation and spelling (GPS) papers 1 (questions) and 2 (spelling)
- Wednesday 10th May: English reading paper
- Thursday 11th May: mathematics papers 1 (arithmetic) and 2 (reasoning)
- Friday 12th May: mathematics paper 3 (reasoning)

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Year R/1 - Phoenix

What a fantastic start to Spring term R/1 have had! (:) They have all settled back into the classroom well and have continued to amaze me with their fabulous attitude to learning. In English, Reception have been learning the story 'The train ride'. They all made their own train tickets and boarded a train to experience a train journey. They listened out to the noises they could hear and discussed what they could see. The children are trying really hard to learn the story using actions and have produced some wonderful writing based on the text. Year 1s focus text has been 'The way back home'. The children have really enjoyed this text and have produced some fantastic writing from it. I can't wait to read their own stories towards the end of this term. In Maths, Reception have been working on their numbers to 8 and Year 1 have been working on representing numbers to 20 using resources and word cards. In History, the children are learning about homes. They have enjoyed comparing houses from the past and noticing similarities and differences to their own houses. In Science, the children have continued their learning on materials and have been exploring their properties. What a busy 2 weeks! Keep up the great work Phoenix class! (:)



Year 2 - Dragon

Year 2, what an amazing start we've had this term. In Maths we have been working so hard on our understanding of money. We have counted pence, pounds and compared amounts of money using a range of coins and notes. In English, we have been focusing on our new story 'Building Boy'. We have been working on our sentence stacking, creating sentences with a range of writing techniques. In science, we have been looking at humans. We have focused on the different life cycle stages of humans, and we've looked at what humans need to survive. In RE, we are continuing to look at Muslims and their key beliefs. In geography, we have been looking at the town of Northampton, identifying a range of physical and human features of the town and surrounding areas. In DT, we are looking at healthy food options and we are getting ready to create our own healthy fruit salads. Well done everyone, keep up the good work. 😊

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Year 3/4 - Centaur

Another busy few weeks for Centaur class. We have begun our new English unit, writing a persuasive holiday brochure. Our text we are working on together looks at Skara Brae and how wonderful it would have been for Stone Age people to have a holiday there. We have been superstars in using our prior learning on the Stone Age in History to help us with this and have been coming up with some really creative and persuasive sentences. In Science, we have been focusing on nutrition and the nutrients our bodies need to grow and function well. This week, we looked particularly at food labelling and the information this could give us about what we choose to put in our bodies - we found some very surprising things out! We then presented this information in tables and a bar chart, to compare sugar and fat content of different foods. In Geography we have located Europe on a map and used our map skills to locate given countries and their capital cities. We have been able to use positional language to describe the location of these countries in comparison to one another. Finally, in Art, we have started our work on 3D sculpture, looking at the work of Magdelene Odundo and Barbara Hepworth. Next week, we will begin making our own sculptures using soap! Well done Centaur class - lots of hard work once again! Keep it up!



Year 5/6 - Griffin

Griffin Class have made an excellent start to 2023! We have started new topics throughout all areas of the curriculum. In Geography, the children have started learning about Mountains - features of mountains and different types of mountains, using Google Earth and Maps to find where they are located in the world. In Science, our new topic is all about 'The Human Lifecycle'. The children have started the topic by finding out the gestation periods of different mammals and comparing these. This week they have looked at data about a foetus' growth in the womb, the children have then created graphs based on this data. In English, through shared writing, the children are creating a Non-Chronological Report all about Mount Everest, relating this to their learning in Geography. Year 6 have been working incredibly hard in Maths learning how to multiply and divide fractions, I'm always so proud of their perseverance when tackling some of these tricky areas of Maths. An excellent start to the new term, well done! Keep it up 🙂
