
Dear Parents/Carers,

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Year R/1 - Phoenix

What a great start to Autumn 2 R/1 have had. The children are enjoying our topic of celebrations and have loved learning about Bonfire night, Diwali and Remembrance Day so far. In English, Year 1 are enjoying their new focus text 'Little Red Riding Hood' and have been writing sentences to describe the woods. The Reception children have been working hard in their phonics lessons and have produced some wonderful writing linking to the sounds that fireworks make. In Maths, the reception children have been working on their number recognition and are enjoying learning the ten town characters. Year 1 have been learning about shapes and making patterns. They are just starting their new unit on addition and subtraction and have been working on recognising parts and wholes. R/1 have also been enjoying their weekly sessions to our Wetland area and have been observing what changes they can spot in Autumn, as well as producing a variety of wonderful forest crafts. Well done R/1 - Keep up the fantastic work. 😊



Year 2 - Dragon

Wow! What a busy half term it has been so far Year 2! We have been very busy working on our Christmas play and are excited to perform this in a few weeks at the Masque. In English this term, we have been focusing on the traditional tale of Little Red Riding Hood. We have been using our senses to help us write excellent descriptions of the forest. In Maths, we have been focusing on addition and subtraction and are using our knowledge of number bonds to 10 to help explore number bonds to 100. In Science, we have been exploring living things and their habitats. We have classified things into Living, Never Lived and Dead and are currently learning about the 6 major habitats of the world. In Geography, we have been learning about the world and have specifically focused on exploring the continents and oceans. In Music, we have explored the 4 families of the orchestra and can identify some of the instruments within these families. I am so impressed with all your hard work this term, keep up the super work!

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Year 3/4 - Centaur

Another busy few weeks for Centaur class. In English we have been working immensely hard on completing our Roman diaries from the perspective of a slave attending Gladiator games at the amphitheatre. We have now begun our next unit - writing a persuasive social media post about Christmas desserts - and even tried some chocolate yule log in our English lessons to help with vocabulary collection. Yum! In Science, we have been comparing 3,4 and 5 step food chains, showing our understanding of producers, prey and predators. We enjoyed our forest school afternoon too, where we played food chain games and looked for evidence of food chains in our local environment. In History, we had a super day with our visitor, Lisa, who was really a Roman woman from a poor family. We learned so much from her, and had the opportunity to handle lots of artefacts, and take part in many authentic Roman activities. We are now moving on to thinking about daily life in Roman Britain, and researching what the Romans did for us while they were here. A very busy few weeks for Centaur class, and lots more learning to keep ourselves busy with! With Christmas play rehearsals now in full swing, we are going to be very busy bees! Keep up the amazing work Centaurs. 😊



Year 5/6 - Griffin

The children have been working incredibly hard, continuing into the new half term. Recently in English, the children have been writing postcards with a twist, as part of our Crime and Punishment unit. Through shared writing, the children have written a postcard from prison in the role of Goldilocks. As part of their independent writes, the children will be choosing their own character from a fairytale (a bad character!) and writing a postcard from prison. In Science, the children have been learning all about how light travels. They have created their own periscopes and used torches to show that light only travels in straight lines. In Maths, Year 6 have been working incredibly hard. They have finished their first fraction unit, looking at adding and subtracting fractions. Next, they will work through another fraction unit where they will be learning how to multiply and divide fractions. Rehearsals are well under way in preparation for our Christmas Play the children are working very hard to learn their lines. Thank you for all your support with this! Have a lovely weekend. 😊
