
FOLS Easter Bonnet/Cap workshop

Year 5 Science Workshop

This week, Year 5 had the fantastic opportunity to take part in a Science lesson at Latimer Secondary School. They investigated displacement reactions, experimenting with different types of metals and solutions to see what would happen and looking for signs of chemical reactions. The children showed excellent enquiry skills - super work Year 5!

Drama workshops

Last week, all the children had the opportunity to take part in some very exciting drama workshops.

Year R/1 and Year 2 were given a top-secret mission to retrieve all of the books that the book thief had stolen. To complete the mission, they had to dive under lasers and tiptoe along walls! After their mission they created a freeze frame as a Superhero and then another in disguise.



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In Year 3/4, the children worked on different activities linked to the story of Charlie and the Chocolate Factory. They created freeze frames in groups to demonstrate different parts of the story, and considered how the feelings of the characters could be shown using facial expressions. They had a great time - it was over too soon!



Year 5/6 had a fantastic time exploring the book Wonder through dance and drama activities. They explored how to display different emotions through facial expressions and body language. The children had to create freeze frames demonstrating a child being left out and then being accepted into the group. These activities allowed the children to build a connection between the book and everyday life as the key theme of the session was that we all have a choice of being right and being kind to others.

Year 2 - Dragon

The term is going by so guickly and we can't believe there is only 2 weeks left! Year 2 have been working so hard this half term. In English we have been exploring poetry and trying to include suffixes in our writing. In Maths we have finished our multiplication and division unit and we have been superstars when learning our 2, 5 and 10 times table multiplication and division facts. We are now exploring measuring length and height in metres and centimetres. In Science we are learning about animals and have been matching animals to their offspring and exploring the life cycles of different animals. In Geography we have been learning about Kenya and have been exploring Nairobi using aerial images and Google Maps. Keep up the hard work Year 2. 😊

Year 3/4 - Centaur

Centaur class have had a busy few weeks. In English, we have been completing an explanation on how the digestive system works and now have begun planning our own explanation to write independently next week. In Science, we have been comparing the 3 states of matter - solids, liquids and gases, and have observed how water can exist in all 3 states if we heat and cool it. We were really surprised to observe how water vapour from the kettle began to form water droplets in a sandwich bag when we had left it to cool for a while! In Geography we have got our work on London well underway, and developed our map skills by identifying London boroughs, and using grid references to locate famous London landmarks and attractions. We have been thoroughly enjoying welcoming James from NMPAT each Tuesday for our Djembe drumming workshops. We are building towards a short performance of what we've learned in the last week of term - we hope many of you can join us so we can show off our Djembe skills! All children have been working hard on their times tables - please do continue this at home - I've been really proud of their achievements and progress with this! Have a lovely weekend everyone. 😳



Year 5/6 - Griffin

Since returning from half term, Year 5&6 have started a new English unit looking at one of Greta Thunberg's speeches about climate change. The children have explored different persuasive techniques used through the speeches and, through shared writing, we have started to our own versions. In Maths, Year 6 have been working through a statistics unit, reading and interpreting data from bar charts, line graphs and pie charts. In Geography, the children have started a new unit all about 'The Amazon' which builds on their previous learning about North & South America. The children learnt about the size of the Amazon Rainforest - it covers land in 9 countries in South America! In Science, the children have started a new unit all about properties of materials. Over the last two weeks, the children have taken part in experiments where they have investigated how the temperature of water affects the dissolvability of sugar and how different mixtures can be separated. Have a lovely weekend everyone - ready for our residential on Monday! 😊
